## Overview:

Welcome to English III! This course is designed to be a rigorous, writing-intensive, college preparatory English class. The scope of this class is American Literature, but we will be incorporating a broad variety of media, including cinema, music, photography, and visual art, in addition to poetry, drama, fiction, and nonfiction texts. Students will explore a several historical literary and artistic movements, and execute high-level analysis by interpreting texts through a variety of critical lenses. All texts will be the subject of analysis through class discussion, essays, and some creative projects. Be prepared to read a lot, write a lot, laugh, cry,
 and wrestle with the big questions of human existence.

## Classroom Norms

1. Arrive on time and prepared to participate fully in class, every day.

- Prepared meaning physically, with all materials and classwork, and emotionally, with a positive attitude.

2. Never give less than your best effort.
3. Be respectful, both to me and your classmates. Assume best intentions of those around you.
4. Care and advocate for yourself and one another.

- If you're stuck, lost, confused, etc. ask me or a classmate.

5. Cell phones remain on silent and away for the entire period.
6. If you must miss class time, be proactive and responsible for your work. I will happily help you, but it is your job to catch yourself up.

## Required Daily Materials:

Coming to class unprepared will result in the loss of participation points.
Class Participation: You are expected to be fully engaged participants every day.

- Class participation will be classified as a "Performance-Based Assessment" and will likely be the largest single grade each quarter.
- Participation points are lost for violating classroom norms and expectations (listed above), disengagement, latenesses, and any other behavior that does not represent your best self.


## Homework and Late Work Policy:

- Expect homework or assigned reading every night. Missing homework will often result in an inability to participate in class.
- For typical homework assignments, late work will be accepted within 3 days of the due date for half credit ONLY IF it is done very well.
- Major assignments will be deducted $10 \%$ for each day late, down to $50 \%$ deducted from your earned grade. After that, I may not accept it.
- If needed, we can meet to discuss an extension in advance of the due date. The earlier you come to me, the more flexible I can be in offering extensions.
- I stop accepting late work one week before grades close.

Cell Phone Policy:
IF I SEE YOUR PHONE ONCE: You will receive a warning to put your phone away and lose a participation point.
IF I SEE YOUR PHONE TWICE: You will lose another participation point. You will receive a detention $\underline{\mathbf{O R}}$ you may place your phone in phone jail until the end of the period.
IF CELL PHONE USE IS A PERSISTENT PROBLEM: Losing participation points regularly will make it impossible to get a good grade. If a student cannot regulate their behavior, we will work together with their parents to find a solution


## Academic Integrity:

- Any form of cheating, copying, or plagiarism will result in an immediate zero for all parties involved, a phone call home, and a referral to the dean's office.
- Once again: all parties involved will receive a zero. I do not care who copied whom.
- All essays and major assignments will be run through an online plagiarism checker. Please, do not even try to plagiarize.


## Latenesses:

- You are expected to be here and ready to work (eg. seated, materials ready, attentive) at the bell.
- Arriving after the bell without a pass constitutes lateness. All lateness will be documented and will result in the loss of participation points. Excessive lateness will result in detentions, phone calls home, and parent conferences if needed.
- IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO GET A LATE PASS FROM YOUR PREVIOUS TEACHER. Do not say "she didn't give me one" or "you can call him."
- 2 latenesses in a week will result in a detention.


## Absences:

- For typical excused absences, work may be made up for full credit within an extension period equal to time missed (eg. 2 days of excused absence, makeup work due two days after your return).
- I will do everything I can to help you, but you are responsible for finding out what you missed and catching up.
- For unexcused absences, you will receive a zero for that day's participation and all work you missed.


## Classes Cut:

- A class cut will result in a zero for all the day's work (including tests and presentations), a detention, and an immediate call home.


## Food and Drink:

- Small snacks that create no smell or mess are permitted. NO NUTS ALLOWED.
- Water bottles are permitted.
- These privileges will be immediately revoked if they become a distraction or if any mess or garbage is left behind after class.


## Phone Calls Home:

- You, your parent(s)/guardian(s), and I all want you to be successful. If needed, all three parties will work together to make that happen.
- I will call home for any student whose grade is in danger of falling below a 70\%.
- I will call home for any student struggling to meet the expectations of the class, or bring their best self to class every day.
