Response should cite ***at least*** two pieces of evidence from the text. Paragraphs should be well-organized (I encourage you to use the body paragraph frame on the back of this sheet). 1. Read *The Great Gatsby* through the Marxist lens. What statement does the book make about social class? FOR EXAMPLE:
 - a. How does money affect people and relationships?
 - b. How do characters of different classes interact with each other?

2. Read *The Great Gatsby* through the feminist lens. What statement does the book make about gender? FOR EXAMPLE:
 - a. Are women in *Gatsby* powerful? What kinds of power do they have or not have?
 - b. How are women treated by the men in the book? Why is this significant?

3. Analyze 2-3 symbols from *The Great Gatsby* and explain what they tell us about Gatsby's dreams and/or how they foreshadow his fate.
