

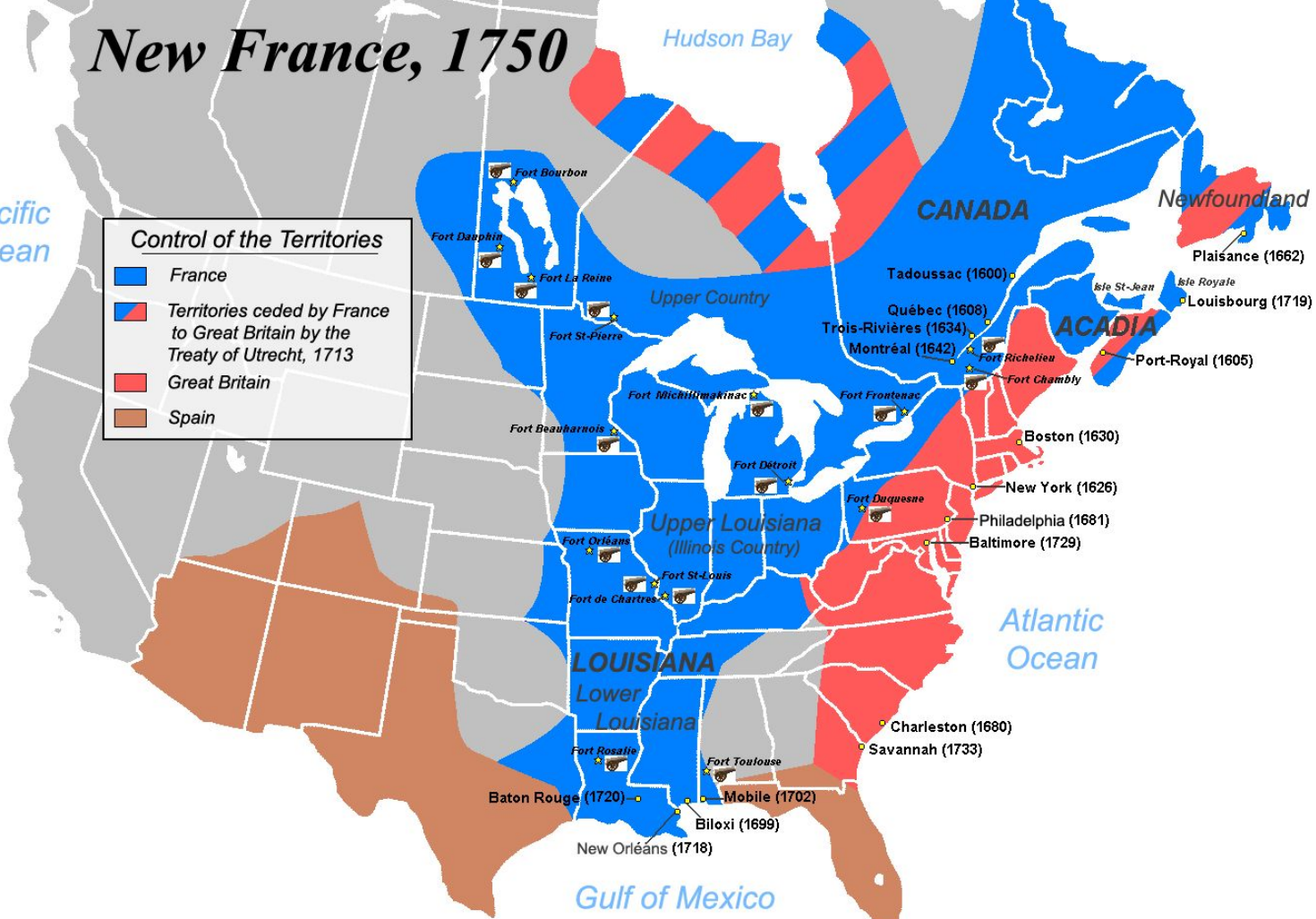
New France, 1750

French vs. English Colonial Empires

- **French:** Mostly single men engaged in fur trapping and trading.
 - Furs caught in the north traded down the Mississippi to New Orleans, back to Europe.
 - Traded extensively with natives, often intermarried.



French vs. English Colonial Empires

- **English:** Early settlers brought entire families, sought to create new societies to displace Native Americans.
 - Trade ties, generally distrustful of natives.
 - Ultimately desired indian lands.



Native Americans Before the War

- **Native Americans-** Benefitted from the rivalry and tension between the French and British.
 - Played Europeans against one another.



The French and Indian War Or, the Seven Years' War

- France and Britain rivals.
- Both sides claim land in the Ohio river valley is theirs.
- French begin building military forts along the Ohio River (western PA)
- Virginia Governor Dinwiddie orders a 22 year old officer to lead a militia into the wilderness.



The French and Indian War Or, the Seven Years' War

George Washington

- Leads inexperienced Virginians North.
- Negotiates and allies with Iroquois league.
- Engages in brutal guerilla warfare in the wilderness.
- Makes lots of mistakes, but is seen as a hero throughout the colonies.

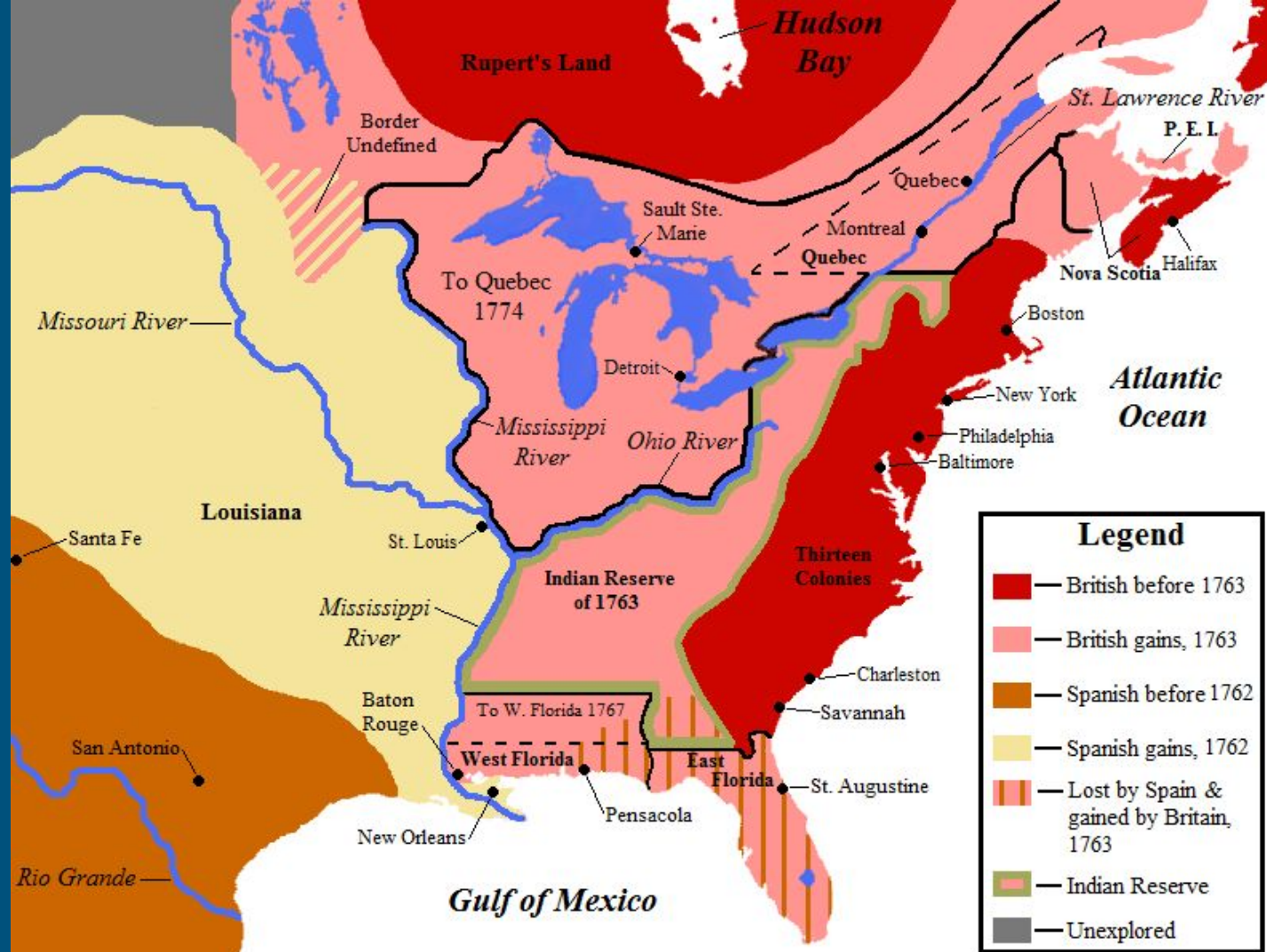
Fun Facts:

- Left school at 15 to become a surveyor
- At 26, he married Martha Dandridge Custis, a widow who already had two children. He never had any children of his own.
- 6'2" tall and 200 pounds - he was one of our biggest presidents.
- His favorite food was cream of peanut soup
- He bred hound dogs (whose names include Tarter, True Love, and Sweet Lips)
- Suffered from toothaches - At 57, he had all his teeth pulled and wore false teeth made of ivory (not wood)

French and Indian War: Results

- France cedes tons of land to Britain (Canada, the great lakes, the midwest)
- Britain and France hate each other EVEN MORE
- Britain doubles its national debt
- Tons of British soldiers hanging out in North America
- Britain names all lands west of the Appalachian Mountains an Indian Reservation.
